Prayer in the Book of Acts (Part 2)

Acts 4:23–31 (ESV) \rightarrow see background in verses 13-22

Prayer points:

- Pray that we (and Christians around the world) would obey God rather than men.
- Pray that like these disciples we would *first* turn to God in prayer when faced with persecution and threats.
- Praise God for His sovereign power, displayed through creation and through His rulership of the nations despite their feeble rebellion.
- Praise God that He works good out of the plans of wicked men including His glorious plan of redemption through the injustice of the cross!

Prayer points:

- Pray for BOLDNESS in speaking God's Word despite the direction of your culture and the threats of your government.
- Pray that God would display His power through miraculous signs and wonders around us, including the saving and discipling of many souls!
- Pray that we would be filled with God's Holy Spirit submitting to *His* control (see Ephesians 5:18-21).

²⁹And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to Your servants to continue to speak Your Word with all boldness,

³⁰while You stretch out Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of Your holy Servant Jesus."

³¹And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the Word of God with boldness.
